Qualification: Doctorate in Psychology, meeting requirements for HCPC and BPS registration (mandatory)

Banding: While Gateway Psychology does not band jobs, the Clinical Psychologist or Counselling Psychologist position we have available is equivalent to NHS AfC Band 7-8a role, depending on experience.

Experience: Clinical experience of working with children, families and young people is essential and post-qualified work experience in a clinical environment is desirable. DPP training highly desirable.

Minimum of one year in a suitable environment with children, young people and their families is mandatory.

Safeguarding: Safeguarding children, young people and vulnerable adults is of utmost importance to our team. An enhanced DBS check will be mandatory for this position, as well as thorough reference checks.
